Joint Endeavour for Emancipation Training & Action for women (JEETA) focuses on women's empowerment and leadership development at the grassroots level in India. The organization forms self-help groups for women to build their capacity to raise community voices on issues of poverty and gender; and generate demand for the fulfillment of their rights. JEETA works closely with local bodies like gram panchayats to increase women's participation in creating awareness among the village communities and other stakeholders about public services, schemes, and entitlements meant for women and girls at the local level.


