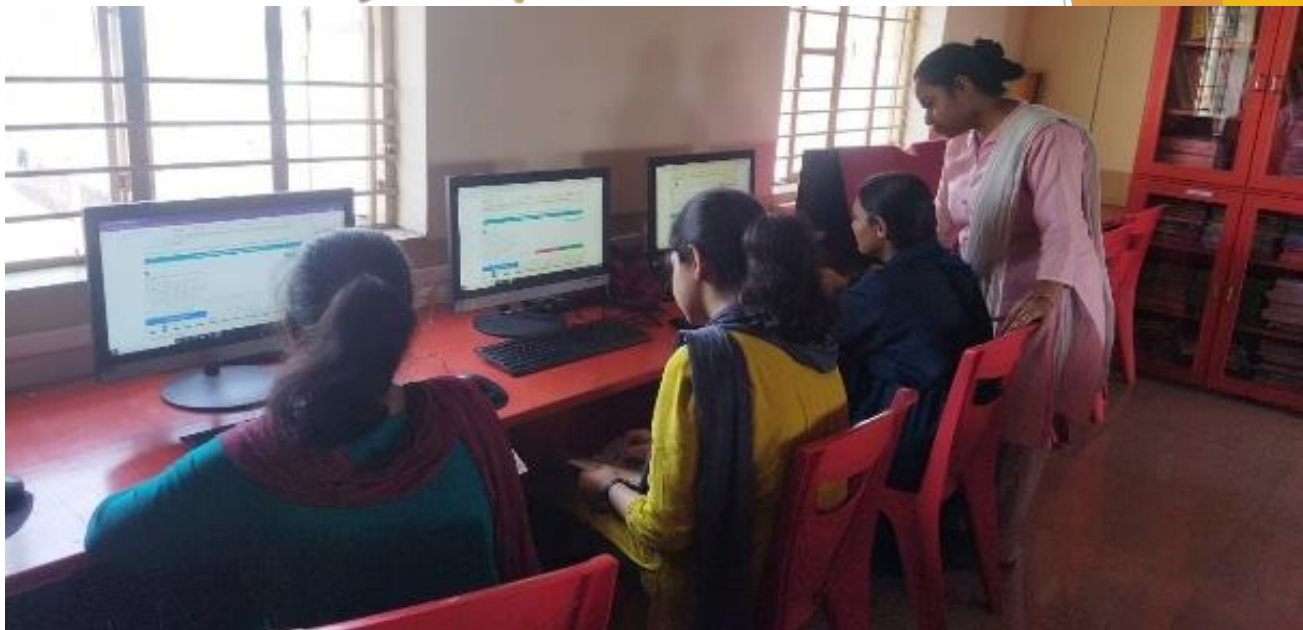



बाल विवाह, बाल श्रम को लेकर जागरूक किया



जरमुंडी में बाल विवाह, बाल श्रम और ह्यूमन ट्रेफिकिंग से मुक्ति को लेकर बैठक करते देवानंद कुमार एवं अन्य।

जरमुंडी, प्रतिनिधि। जरमुंडी बजरंगबली मोड़ में बुधवार को देवानंद कुमार की अध्यक्षता में एक संस्था के पदाधिकारी, सदस्य, स्थानीय जनप्रतिनिधियों एवं ग्रामीणों की बैठक आयोजित हुई। बैठक में जरमुंडी प्रखंड क्षेत्र को बाल विवाह, बाल श्रम और ट्रैफिकिंग से मुक्त कराने को लेकर विस्तारपूर्वक चर्चा हुई। संस्था के सचिव देवानंद कुमार ने बताया कि जरमुंडी प्रखंड के 24 गांव सहित दुमका जिला के 70 गांव बाल विवाह, बाल श्रम और मानव व्यापार मुक्त बनाया जायेगा।

इसको लेकर संस्था, चिल्ड्रेन फाउंडेशन (यूएस) दिल्ली एवं जिला प्रशासन के सहयोग से कार्य करेगी। इसके तहत जरमुंडी प्रखंड क्षेत्र के 24 गांव समेत दुमका जिला के 70 गांवों को बाल विवाह मुक्त करने का निर्णय लिया गया है। इसके साथ ही संस्था मानव तस्करी, बाल श्रम, बच्चों की सुरक्षा विषयों पर भी जिला प्रशासन के

सहयोग से जिले में कार्य करेगी।

देवानंद कुमार ने बताया कि नोबेल पुरस्कार विजेता कैलाश सत्यार्थी ने पूरे देश में बाल विवाह, मानव तस्करी को समाप्त करने और बच्चों की सुरक्षा को लेकर एक अभियान शुरू किया है। बताया कि शुक्रवार पांच मई को दिल्ली में एक समझौता पत्र पर संयुक्त हस्ताक्षर हुआ। जिसमें जिला प्रशासन के साथ मिलकर रणनीति बनाकर जिला के 70 गांव को बाल विवाह मुक्त गांव बनाने का निर्णय लिया गया है। जरमुंडी प्रखंड क्षेत्र के चिन्हित गांव में वहाँ के स्थानीय जनप्रतिनिधि, विभिन्न दलों के प्रतिनिधि, कृषक एवं सामाजिक कार्यकर्ता के साथ समन्वय स्थापित कर कार्यक्रम की सफलता को लेकर चर्चा की गई। बैठक में सुमन कुमार, अंजनी कुमारी, सीता देवी, सरिता कुमारी, रमेश कुमार, माखन कुमार, हीरालाल राय, चांदनी देवी, ममता देवी, अंजू देवी सहित दर्जनों अन्य मौजूद थे।
